The new mapping service is available at http://www.okmaps.ok.gov. Visitors can search up to three local resources at a time by zip code or county. Currently, Oklahoma Maps enables visitors to search for:

- Post Offices
- Schools
- State Parks
- Tag Agencies

Visitors can also view county information, state agency information, and view a list of other state maps available online.
